Lucas Waldin, conductor

These concerts are the North Carolina Symphony debut of Lucas Waldin.

Lucas Waldin has collaborated with artists including Carly Rae Jepsen, Ben Folds, The Canadian Brass, and Buffy Sainte-Marie, in addition to conducting presentations such as *Disney in Concert*, *Blue Planet Live*, *Cirque de la Symphonie*, and the symphonic debut of R&B duo Dvsn as part of the global Red Bull Music Festival.

Waldin has been a guest conductor for numerous orchestras in the United States and Canada, including The Cleveland Orchestra, Houston Symphony, Dallas Symphony Orchestra, Grant Park Symphony Orchestra, St. Louis Symphony Orchestra, Louisiana Philharmonic Orchestra, Vancouver Symphony, Calgary Philharmonic, and Toronto Symphony Orchestra.

Having joined the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra as Resident Conductor in 2009, Waldin was subsequently appointed Artist-in-Residence and Community Ambassador—the first position of its kind in North America. He appeared with the ESO over 150 times and conducted in Carnegie Hall during the orchestra's participation in the 2012 Spring for Music festival. He was awarded the Jean-Marie Beaudet Award in Orchestra Conducting by the Canada Council for the Arts and received a Citation Award from the City of Edmonton for outstanding achievements in arts and culture.

A native of Toronto, Waldin holds degrees in flute and conducting from the Cleveland Institute of Music.



Capathia Jenkins, vocals

These concerts are the North Carolina Symphony debut of Capathia Jenkins.

Brooklyn-born and raised Capathia Jenkins most recently starred on Broadway as "Medda Larkin" in the Disney production of *Newsies*. She made her Broadway debut in Gregory Boyd and Frank Wildhorn's *The Civil War*, where she created the role of Harriet Jackson in 1998. She then starred in the Off-Broadway revival of Stephen Schwartz and John-Michael Tebelak's *Godspell*. She returned to Broadway in *The Look of Love*, which featured Burt Bacharach/Hal David hits, then created the roles of "The Washing Machine" in Jeanine Tesori and Tony Kushner's *Caroline, Or Change* and "Frieda May" in Daniel Goldfarb and Martin Short's *Martin Short: Fame Becomes Me*.

In 2007 she went back to Off-Broadway and starred in Joan Ross Sorkin's one-woman show (*mis*) Understanding Mammy: The Hattie McDaniel Story, for which she was nominated for a Drama Desk Award. She was also seen in Nora Ephron's Love, Loss, and What I Wore.

An active concert artist, Jenkins has appeared with orchestras around the world including The Cleveland Orchestra, Houston Symphony, Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra (with Marvin Hamlisch), National Symphony Orchestra, Atlanta Symphony Orchestra, Seattle Symphony, Utah Symphony, Minnesota Orchestra, Colorado Symphony, Toronto Symphony Orchestra, Edmonton Symphony Orchestra, San Diego Symphony, and the Hong Kong Philharmonic. She was a soloist with the Festival Český Krumlov in the Czech Republic. In 2011, she performed in the *Broadway Ambassadors to Cuba* concert as part of the Festival De Teatro De La Habana. She has been a guest soloist with Peter Nero and the Philly Pops and with the Cincinnati Pops.

Her television credits include 30 Rock, The Practice, Law & Order: SVU, The Sopranos, and Law & Order. She can be seen in the 2012 film Musical Chairs, directed by Susan Seidelman, and appears on the film soundtracks for Nine, Chicago, and Legally Blonde 2: Red, White & Blonde.



Ryan Shaw, vocals

These concerts are the North Carolina Symphony debut of Ryan Shaw.

Ryan Shaw is a three-time Grammy-nominated artist for his solo projects *This is Ryan Shaw*, *In Between*, and *Real Love*. His 2019 album *Imagining Marvin* showcases Marvin Gaye hits alongside original songs and features Grammy Award-winning co-writers and special guests.

Shaw has shared the stage with such artists as Van Halen, Bonnie Raitt, John Legend, B.B. King, and Jill Scott. His music has been featured on television shows including FOX's So You Think You Can Dance and ABC's Dancing with the Stars, Grey's Anatomy, and Lincoln Heights, and in the films My Blueberry Nights, Bride Wars, and Sex and the City.

Shaw starred as Judas in the Lyric Opera of Chicago's Olivier Award-winning London production of *Jesus Christ Superstar*, as the original Stevie Wonder in *Motown: The Musical* on Broadway, and on London's West End as the Soul of Michael Jackson in *Thriller Live*. He debuted at Radio City Music Hall in the *Dream Concert* benefit for the Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial.

Carnegie Hall appearances include an Elton John and Bernie Taupin tribute, *Honor! A Celebration of the African American Cultural Legacy*, and a Nat King Cole 100th Birthday concert with The New York Pops. Recent and upcoming concerts include Nat King Cole at 100 with the National Symphony Orchestra, at The John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, and *Aretha Franklin: A Tribute to the Queen of Soul* with numerous orchestras throughout North America.
